4. FIRST AID MEASURES**Eye Contact**

Hold eyes open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.

Skin Contact

Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.

Information on toxicological effects

Symptoms Symptoms of overexposure may be headache, dizziness, tiredness, nausea and vomiting.

Delayed and immediate effects as well as chronic effects from short and long-term exposure

Chronic toxicity	Fluoxastrobin showed reduced body weight and hepatocytomegaly and cytoplasmic changes associated with increased serum liver alkaline phosphatase indicative of cholestasis. Tebuconazole caused liver, spleen, adrenal and/or eye effects at high doses in chronic studies in rats and dogs.
Mutagenicity	Fluoxastrobin, Tebuconazole: Not genotoxic in laboratory studies.
Carcinogenicity	Fluoxastrobin: Not carcinogenic. Tebuconazole is classified by EPA as a Group C carcinogen (possible human carcinogen) based on liver tumors in mice and no evidence of carcinogenicity in rats.
Neurological effects	Fluoxastrobin: No neurotoxicity observed in animal studies. Tebuconazole: Evidence of transient neurobehavioral effects in acute, subchronic and/or developmental neurotoxicity studies in rats.
Reproductive toxicity	Fluoxastrobin: In the reproduction study, there was evidence of decreased body weight in offspring, delayed preputial separation, and incomplete ossification. Tebuconazole: No toxicity to reproduction in animal studies.
Developmental toxicity	Fluoxastrobin: Evidence of transient body weight loss and decreased food consumption. Tebuconazole: Reproductive toxin in animal studies only at doses acutely toxic to the maternal animal.
